We designed a Christmas card with some festive jokes to send to the residents of St. Carthage's.

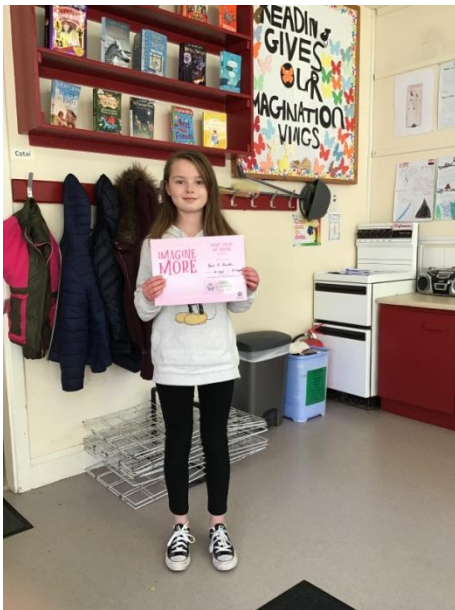
We won't be able to visit this year but tune in to our website for our Christmas plays and poems!
